

AFS Forum – 2024: Partner Side Event Food Systems National Convenors – Pivotal role in accelerating the transformation of Africa's food systems

Introduction

National Food Systems Convenors play a critical and strategic role in leading national efforts to champion the food systems transformation agenda. They are the central thread in organizing and bringing to life the "whole-government" approach, which is essential for fostering a food systems perspective. This approach significantly enhances a government's capacity to plan, implement, and achieve results aligned with food systems transformation goals and targets. The UN Food Systems Coordination Hub plays a crucial role in providing an integrated UN support to National Convenors in fulfilling these responsibilities.

This side event is organized as part of ongoing engagement and collaboration to support National Convenors. It takes place at a pivotal moment when the consolidation of country-specific operational frameworks and the activities of National Convenors is crucial. This timing is particularly significant as the continent embarks on a comprehensive and inclusive review of the CAADP-Malabo framework and the development of the post-Malabo CAADP.

Objectives

The side event offers a unique opportunity for National Convenors and the UN Food Systems Coordination Hub and other stakeholders to exchange insights, share perspectives, and co-create strategies to advance national food systems transformation. The event will focus on the following objectives and sub-themes:

- The National Convenors (NCs): Defining the unique value NCs bring and ensuring its realization. Positioning NCs within the broader landscape of national and regional food systems transformation actors, examining their roles and responsibilities, key enablers, challenges, and opportunities. Offering insights and perspectives on how countries and the continent can and should maximize the value NCs contribute to accelerating the implementation and achievement of systemic capacities necessary for food systems transformation goals and targets.
- Cross sector (agriculture-food-climate) convergence: The country-based dialogue on key success factors for the UN Food Systems Coordination Hub Convergence Initiative. Participants will share insights and lessons from ongoing programs and initiatives operating within the nexus of food, climate, energy, and social security.



Session Outcomes

In addition to fostering an informed network of National Convenors and strengthening peer relationships, the side event aims to:

- Streamline the key aspects of the National Convenor's roles and responsibilities, along with the practical steps they can take to effectively coordinate and facilitate matchmaking within the food systems ecosystem.
- o Enhance understanding of the factors and incentives that drive successful inter-sectoral collaboration, involving both state and non-state actors.
- Develop practical measures and strategies to incentivize collaborations across agriculture, food, climate, and livelihoods sectors.
