## Background and objectives.

Achieving the SDGs and Paris Agreement requires cross-sector collaboration among governments, stakeholders (private sector, youth and science), and the UN to integrate food systems and climate action agendas. This side event will showcase initiatives and partnerships implemented by the UN Food Systems Coordination Hub, CGIAR and FAO. In particular, the side event will refer to the Hub's Convergence Initiative and Scaling up Climate Ambition on Land Use (SCALA). It will present country case studies that highlight local-level convergence, demonstrating the impact of coordinated efforts on sustainable development transitions.

The side event will present case studies on:

- Integrating National Food Systems Strategies with Climate Commitments to encourage policymakers to ensure that national food systems transformation pathways are incorporated into updates of Nationally Determined Contributions (NDCs) and National Adaptation Plans (NAPs).
- Cross-sector collaboration for sustainable food systems between agriculture, climate, and environmental ministries, as well as international organizations, private sector actors, and civil society, to develop integrated policies that address food systems and climate goals.

## The expected outcomes

- Articulate the Convergence Initiative's framework and SCALA as tools for supporting the achievement of the SDGs and the Paris Agreement.
- Share actionable insights aligned with the SG Call-to-Action at UNFSS+2, the COP28
   Declaration on Sustainable Agriculture, Resilient Food Systems, and Climate Action
- Discuss how resource partners can support the convergence of food systems and climate action nationally.
- Emphasize the priorities of developing countries in the context of the food systems and climate action agendas.
