

# The Food Systems Solutions Webinars: April – November 2025

## Background

In 2025, the Hub will continue to host its Food Systems Solutions Webinar (FSSW) series, which is open to the public, to foster broader engagement on critical issues related to food systems transformation and serve as a platform to increase public awareness about various food systems-related topics.

The webinars build upon the global commitments and outcomes of the UN Food Systems Summit +2 Stocktaking Moment (UNFSS+2) and the Secretary-General's Call to Action. The themes for the 2025 FSSW series align with the objectives of the forthcoming second UN Food Systems Summit +4 Stocktake (UNFSS+4) - **reflecting on progress, strengthening accountability, and unlocking investments** for food systems transformation. The FSSW series is part of the Hub's public outreach activities for all food systems stakeholders to build momentum toward UNFSS+4.

Thursday, 10 April 2025	<b>Foresight for policy innovation: Navigating complexity and uncertainty in food systems</b>	Foresight methodologies are gaining recognition as a valuable tool to facilitate dialogue, navigate uncertainties, and envision alternative futures for food systems. This approach enables stakeholders to anticipate challenges, identify opportunities, and develop more resilient and sustainable food systems for generations to come, bringing tangible outputs in policy, implementation, and finance. Ahead of the upcoming UNFSS+4, the webinar explores why foresight is important and how it can accelerate national food systems' transformation. Thursday, 19 June 2025	<b>Enabling processes for marginalized voices to drive change in food systems</b>	Marginalized groups, including youth, Indigenous Peoples, and women, are vital to the success of food systems yet often remain underrepresented in decision-making processes. Their unique perspectives and experiences are essential for achieving equitable and sustainable food systems transformation. This webinar explores how the UNFSS, in 2021, established a wide Ecosystem of Support that works with marginalized groups to elevate their voices and contributions to change processes. The discussion will identify critical gaps and highlight innovative engagement strategies to break the barriers marginalized groups face in transforming food systems.
