- Convene countries and stakeholders to **review progress on the commitments** made during the FSS and identify successes, enduring bottlenecks and priorities in order to **close the implementation gap** by effectively and efficiently utilizing the MoIs
- Socialize the powerful role of sustainable, equitable, healthy and resilient food systems as critical **SDGs accelerators** among world leaders, national decision-makers and practitioners and food systems actors
- Advocate for **urgent action at scale**, building on the latest evidence that sustainable food systems contribute to better and more sustainable outcomes for people, planet and prosperity leaving no one behind, by sharing concrete cases of transformation led by state and non-state actors

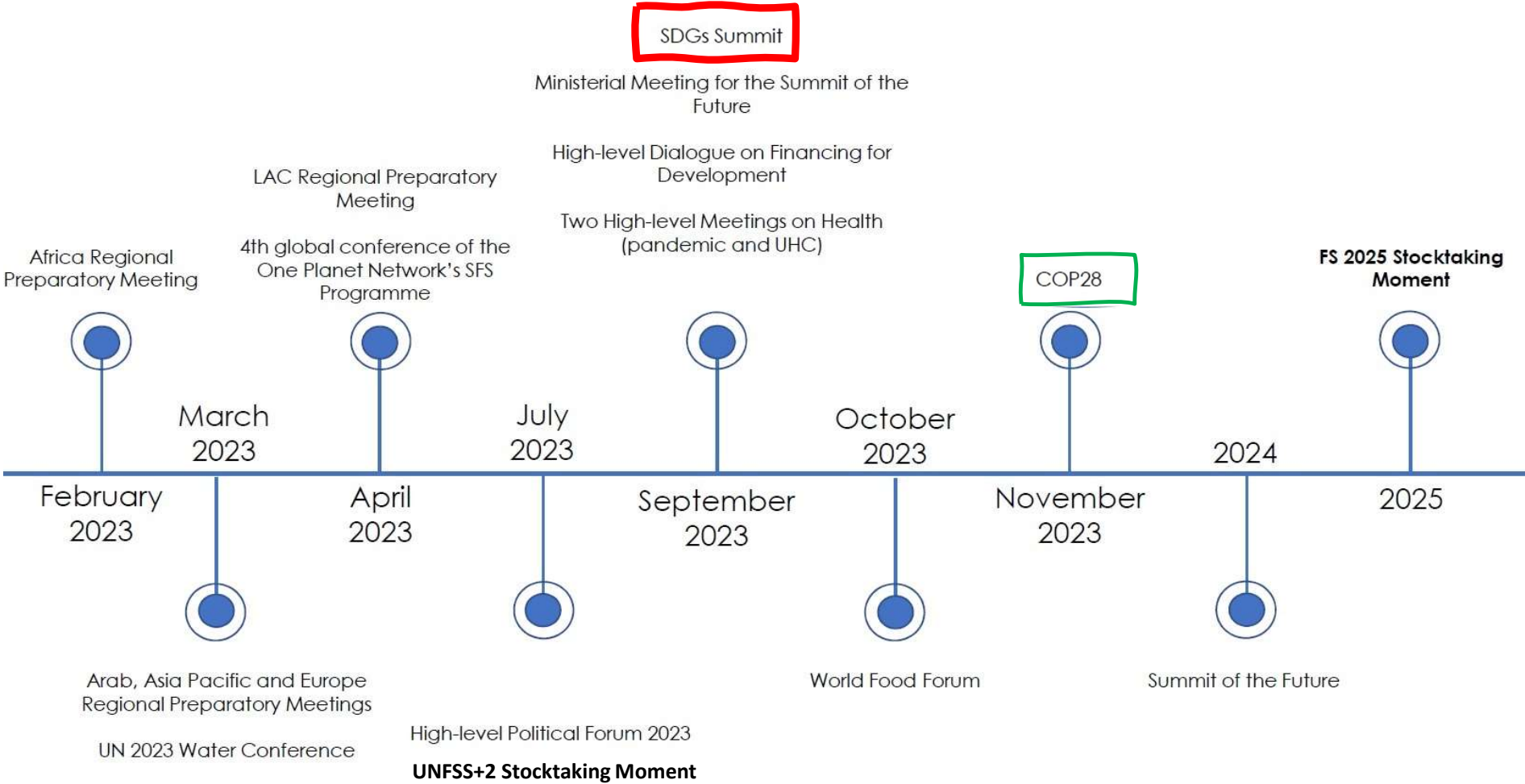




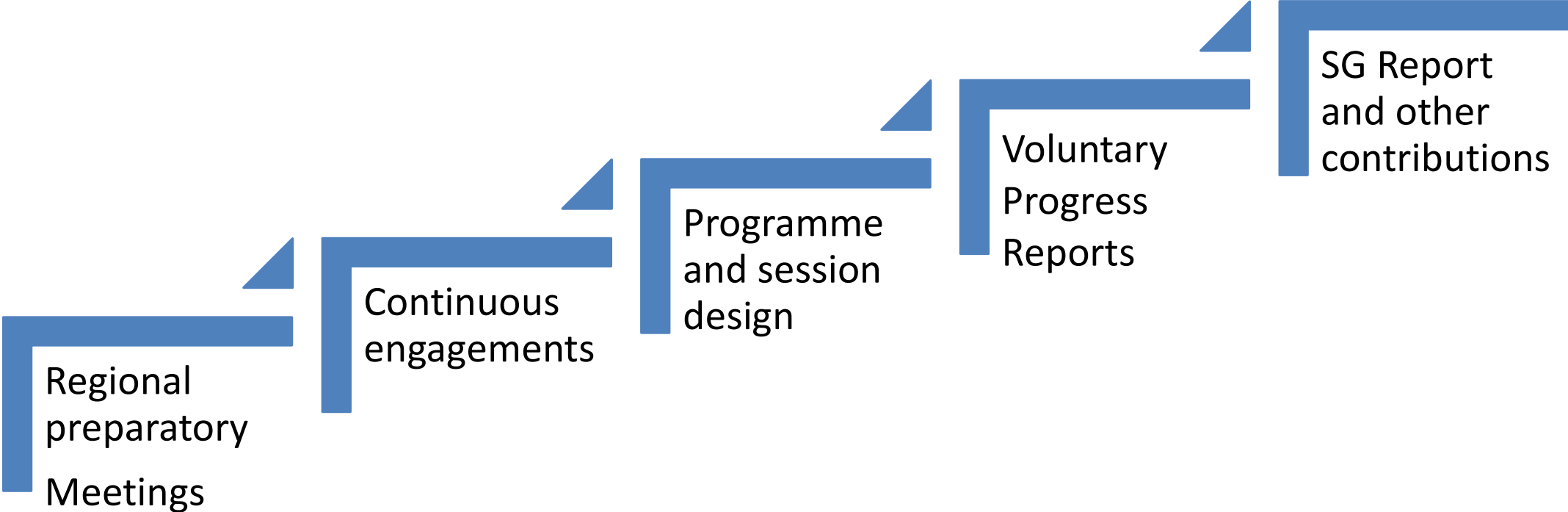

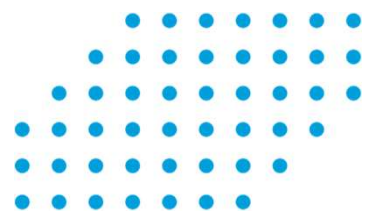
